## Villa Update

We continue to work with the City of Healdsburg and the Tayman Group as the Tayman Group prepares to take over management of the Villa Chanticleer complex once the City Council approves the plan.

We will retain our current bar license and will operate the bar in the Villa until the Tayman Group obtains their license. At that time our license will be restricted to the Annex. The change should have little impact on our use of the Annex, which is covered by a long term lease.

Our biggest challenge will be replacing the income from providing bar service to events in the Villa. We will be looking at different alternatives, including a golf tournament.

The city is planning to remodel the bathrooms to make the ADA compliant. Other possible projects include additional storage for the chairs and tables and replacing the pocket door.

This has been a long and difficult process and we appreciate the efforts of everyone who has helped. A big part of the credit goes to Frank Teuschler and Bob Taylor.


