Speaking of young Veterans, it is the duty and responsibility of each of us to respect one another, regardless of any of the denominators that separate us under the umbrella of our common bonds which ultimately bring us together. Many of us have differing backgrounds, service types, years, and even decades between our times served in the Military, be it Land, Sea or Air. Many of them lost comrades on the battlefield and endured the traumas and hardships that War brings with it.

The priority of our organizations are to make every effort to show them our unyielding support while graciously welcoming them into our group as our own blood. It is not unknown that this new generation at times feel unwelcome into Veteran organizations, as it was for previous members to include our Vietnam Vets. Whether that stereotype has any merit today, it is a sentiment nonetheless for some of these folks. We must double and triple our efforts in conveying our desire to have them included in our organizations, for they alone will be the generation to carry on the legacies that the American Legion upholds and preserves. Reach out to them and do not wait idly by for them to extend their hands first. Thank you.

National POW/MIA Recognition Day

The event was held at Santa Rosa Memorial Park 1900 Franklin Avenue on September 16th. There were about 97 guest attend the event. Participating were Post 111 Riders; American Soldier Freedom Riders; VVA with POW/MIA trailer.

There was a few glitches in getting the program going. Just two days before, our Master of Ceremonies was injured in a bicycle accident so an alternate was needed. Post 111 Commander Lance Ballenger stepped up to the task and did an outstanding job.

The Post 111 honor team performed flawlessly presenting the flags and the rifle team was spot on. Guest Speakers were US Congressman Mike Thompson who read President Obama's Proclamation and presented a framed copy to Lance Ballenger, then he told of his experience in the service while stationed in Vietnam.

California State Senator Mike McGuire read Governor Brown's proclamation and presented a framed copy to **Lance Ballenger**, then he spoke about what the CA government is doing to get housing and better care for veterans.

Sonoma County Supervisor Shirlee Zane spoke about recently getting 60 homeless veterans into The Palms Inn which has recently been converted to lodging for homeless people. The County is also working on other locations to get more veterans off the street and into lodging. She had a gold award to present to WW2 POW **Darrel Schumard** for his contribution to support veterans in Sonoma County. **Darrel** was not available because of a fall he had a few days before. He also was to be a guest speaker.

Mrs. Jean-Marie Heskett and her son Michael McCoy spoke about her family's internment in the Philippines when the Japanese Military conquered the country and placed 36000 civilians into internment camps. Jean-Marie was only 6 years old at the time. They were held for 36 months until the US Army freed them. Her son has written a book about his mother's experience. "Through My Mother's Eyes" available through Amazon or in Barnes & Noble book stores. Work is in progress to produce a movie.

The Missing man table was explained by **Dave Richey**.

Legion 111 Rider Chaplain **Father Ed Howell** provided he Invocation, reading and Benediction. Miss **Abby Volz** sang the National Anthem.

The Windsor Performing Arts Academy singers provided the ending song "Bring Him Home".

Often a client will visit our office for assistance with one issue and discover during an in-depth interview that there are other issues to be addressed and other potential benefits they are eligible for. Our goal is to ensure that every client has access to all benefits they have earned through their service to our nation. I and the Veteran Service Office staff are here to provide Veteran benefit information, claims assistance and referral to other pertinent community services to veterans and their families. Our office is open Monday through Thursday from 8:00AM to 5:00PM. From 8:30 to 9:45, we see clients on a drop in basis (please arrive before 9:15 to ensure that we have time to see you before we start seeing our scheduled appointments). From 10:00 - 5:00 we see clients by appointment only. Please call (707) 565-5960 to schedule an appointment.
