

Korean War Veterans Medal Presentation August 31, 2017

One of the honored veterans, Santa Rosa resident Richard Lewis, said he agreed with the assessment that the Korean War was the "Forgotten War" and he told his students as much when he was a schoolteacher. "When I taught history, I said, the World War II veterans came home to parades and celebrations, the Vietnam veterans came home to get spit on and called baby killers, and the Korean War veterans came home and nobody knew we were gone," said Lewis, 88. "That's why it's called a forgotten war."

Still, Lewis, who served in the Army, said he was glad to know the South Korean government appreciated his service and called the peace medal a "nice honor."





MIAP escort from Cotati to San Andreas to SVNC Dixon September 26, 2017

Six members of ALR Chapter 111, including two members of the Patriot Guard Riders, met at Johnny's Java in Cotati and proceeded to San Andreas to secure the remains of **Berry Lee Jones** an unclaimed U.S. Navy Korean War veteran. Sonoma County Veterans Remains Officer **Ron Collier** was the Road Captain for the escort.

The group made a stop in Lodi, where fifteen riders from the Capital and North Central Region of the Sacramento PGR joined the procession to San Andreas.

After consuming lunch, the group formed a flag line, secured the veteran's remains and proceeded to Dixon. The veteran was transferred to the care of staff at Sacramento Valley National Cemetery that afternoon where Military Honors will be rendered at a later date.


