

So many life's we have touched to let them know that we do care. and all the other things that we have done for others


I hope that all of you feel as good as I do for all we have done. And lets all keep on caring and helping for many years to come.

The Flag is flying and the end of a 2-year project is completed. It has been 2 years since I started to try and replace the old flag pole for the Civil War Memorial at Oak Mound Cemetery in Healdsburg.

I could not start the project without the permission of the owner and that took some time as this was put in placed in 1922 by a group called the GAR. And, no one could give me any direction to even contact someone from that organization, since most have passed on.

Until one day in Raley's I ran into a fellow AL member by the name of **Don Arata** (retired FF from Healdsburg) who has family from the Civil War that are buried at Oak Mound. OMG the door opened within two days it led me in the right direction. Turns out, it was transferred to the Sons of Civil War in 1957 and in a small world setting, the Commander lives in Windsor, so off to his house and move forward with the project.

I received written permission and dropped it off at the cemetery and received the go ahead with the project when the Post provided proof of insurance to the Cemetery.

And then, the construction crew went to work or I should I say **Ken Cody** went to work. Ken as the only crew member dug out the old pole setting it aside and digging a new hole 28" D by 36" in diameter in one day. The next day Ken mixed 15 bags of concrete by hand to complete the base around the pole. I guess he wanted to make sure this pole didn't blow over in a wind storm.

Ken left for a family emergency at 10:30 with the pole set just waiting for the flags to fly. So at 3PM **Eddy Sauers** and I hung the flags and watched them fly in the wind.

This project is complete and turned over to the Sons of the Civil War for the future maintenance of this project. A personal thanks to **Ken Cody** for all his work on the flag pole projects that have been done. One last thing, just don't get in his way when he's doing a project.



American Legion Boy's State 2018

A participatory program in which students become part of the operation of local, county and state government, Boys State was founded in 1935 to counter the socialism-inspired Young Pioneer Camps. American Legion Auxiliary sponsors a separate but similar program for young women called Girls State. American Legion, department of California, Boys State program is held at the University of California Sacramento in June. The course is one week. Approximately one thousand high school juniors from

throughout California attend boys



state every year. District 5 sends 85 high school junior boys this year. This is the largest class District 5 has sent.

The boys roll play vying for governing positions from city level to state level.

They campaign for the office they want. Elections held then situations are presented to solve. It is presented as close to real situations as possible.

At the end of the week the councilors judge each boy, how he faired in his part of the program. Two boys are selected to go to Boys Nation.

Boys Nation, Arlington Virginia in August, is also one week. Forty-nine states take part in Boys State. Hawaii does not participate due to its geographical location.

American Legion Post 111 has a youth recognition dinner at the October meeting to hear the boys and girls share their experience.




On May 23rd, **Ron Collier** was highlighted on KPIX Channel 5 in San Francisco, as a recipient of the **Jefferson Award**.
